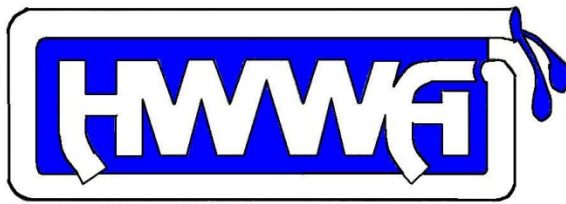

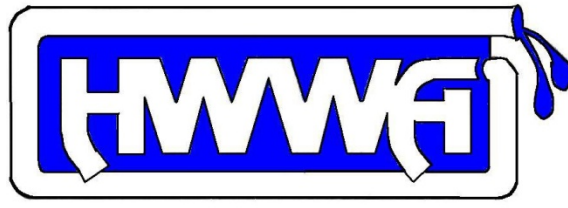

**Personal tour of the Juliet Rice Wichman Botanical Research Center
by Charles R. "Chipper" Wichman, Jr., Chief Executive Officer and NTBG Director**

Over the more than 40 years since it was established, National Tropical Botanical Garden's *(NTBG) herbarium, library, and living collections have been indispensable to its scientific research and conservation programs. Resources that these collections provide, not only to researchers and students in Hawai'i, but also worldwide, are incomparable. The immediate proximity of comprehensive living collections of tropical flora to an extensive herbarium and an extraordinary botanical library is rare.

The NTBG Herbarium contains the most extensive recent collection of Hawaiian and Marquesan plants in existence, with nearly 65,000 specimens. The library is the largest botanical/horticultural collection in Hawai'i, with more than 44,000 books, prints, and images.

The Botanical Research Center at NTBG's national headquarters on Kaua'i, completed in early 2008, brings together the herbarium and library under a single roof. The Center includes research laboratories and offices, a dirty room for processing and drying new plant specimens, and dedicated work space for staff, students, and visiting researchers.

To protect the invaluable herbarium and library collections, the building is designed to withstand hurricane-force winds. It was built to accommodate 50 years of planned growth of the collections. Mechanical and electrical systems provide multiple levels for backup operation during an emergency.

Consistent with NTBG's commitment to conservation and the environment, the building was designed to be environmentally sustainable. The project was registered with the U.S. Green Building Council's LEED® (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Green Building Rating System, and was awarded LEED® Gold Certification, making it the first building on the island of Kaua'i recognized under the rating system.

The Botanical Research Center now serves not only as a resource for national and international researchers, but also as a significant resource for Hawai'i and the local community. Through NTBG's education and outreach programs local students will be able to learn firsthand about tropical botany, horticulture, and ethno botany, as well as the importance of traditional knowledge and natural and cultural resource management



Charles R. "Chipper" Wichman, Jr., is NTBG's Chief Executive Officer and serves as Director of the organization. Prior to serving as the organization's Acting Director for nearly 1-1/2 years, Mr. Wichman served as Director of NTBG's Limahuli Garden on Kaua'i since 1994 and also as Director of NTBG's Kahanu Garden on Maui from 1997 through early 2002.

Mr. Wichman joined the organization in 1976, graduating from its Horticultural Internship program. He spent his early career developing Limahuli Garden. During this time, he obtained a Special Subzone designation in the Conservation District for the entire Limahuli Valley, restored ancient taro terraces, developed a collection of rare and endangered native Hawaiian plants, opened the garden to educational tours, and added the 989-acre Limahuli Preserve. Subsequently Limahuli was named the Best Natural Botanical Garden in the United States by the American Horticultural Society.

Mr. Wichman brought renewed focus to NTBG's conservation and horticulture efforts, a greater appreciation of the native Hawaiian culture, and undertook a major capital campaign. Under his leadership, NTBG built its fourth building at the headquarters campus, a major research facility which has received wide attention for its "green architecture."
