

WITNESSETH:

THAT IN CONSIDERATION of the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) paid by the GRANTEE to the GRANTOR, the receipt of which is acknowledged, and the covenants contained in this grant of easement to be performed by the GRANTEE, the GRANTOR does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey to the GRANTEE a non-exclusive easement in perpetuity on, over, and under that certain parcel of land located generally at Koloa District, Kaua'i, Hawaii, Tax Map Key No. (4) 2-6-019: 018; District: Koloa, Kaua'i, Hawaii; PROJECT NAME: Parcel FF, SUBDIVISION NO.: S-2019-09, and more

AND IN FURTHER CONSIDERATION of the rights granted to the GRANTEE the benefits accruing to the GRANTOR and the Association under this easement, the GRANTOR and GRANTEE further covenant, agree, and promise as follows:

- 1. That should the GRANTEE disturb in any way the ground which is the subject of the easement area, the GRANTEE shall at its own expense restore the ground to its original condition to the extent that such restoration is reasonable;
- 2. That the GRANTEE shall indemnify and save the GRANTOR and the Association, and their respective successors and assigns, harmless from and against all damage to the GRANTOR's property and the easement area and all liability for injury to or the death of

persons when such damage, injury, or death is caused by the negligence of the GRANTEE, its officers, agents and employees while using the easement area;

- 3. That the GRANTEE shall not assign its rights under this easement without the prior written consent of the GRANTOR; provided that the GRANTEE may assign its rights to a successor of the GRANTEE duly created by law;




The GRANTEE is further allowed the right of ingress and egress at any time to, from, and through the easement area, with or without vehicles or equipment, as the GRANTEE deems necessary for the proper operation of its water system.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the GRANTEE forever; provided that should the GRANTEE cease to use the easement area for the purposes described for a continuous period of two (2) calendar years, this easement shall terminate and the interest granted shall immediately and without the GRANTOR's re-entry revert to the GRANTOR. In such an event, this easement shall cease to exist by operation of the GRANTEE's non-use, without any necessary action on the GRANTOR's part.

AND IN FURTHER CONSIDERATION of the rights granted to the GRANTEE the benefits accruing to the GRANTOR under this easement, the GRANTOR and GRANTEE further covenant, agree, and promise as follows:

- 1. That should the GRANTEE disturb in any way the ground which is the subject of the easement area, the GRANTEE shall at its own expense restore the ground to its original condition to the extent that such restoration is reasonable;
- 2. That the GRANTEE shall indemnify and save the GRANTOR harmless from and against all damage to the GRANTOR's property and all liability for injury to or the death of persons when such damage, injury, or death is caused by the negligence of the GRANTEE, its officers, agents and employees while using the easement area;
- That the GRANTEE shall not assign its rights under this easement without the prior written consent of the GRANTOR; provided that the GRANTEE may assign its rights to a successor of the GRANTEE duly created by law;
- 4. That should the GRANTOR's development plans require that the easement area and/or waterworks facility improvements within, on, or under the easement area be re-located, the GRANTOR will, at the GRANTOR's own expense and pursuant to the GRANTEE's instructions and specifications, re-locate the affected easement area and waterworks facility improvements and appurtenances without interruption of the GRANTEE's services;
- 5. That the GRANTOR shall at no time erect any building foundation of any kind below the surface of the land which is the subject of the easement area or any building or structure of any kind (other than roads, sidewalks, curbs or similar appurtenances) on the surface of the land which is the subject of the easement area unless the GRANTOR receives the prior written consent of the GRANTEE.

Only lawn grass shall be planted within three (3) feet of all meter boxes, fire hydrants, and other waterworks facility improvements and appurtenances. No trees with aggressive root systems shall be planted within twenty (20) feet of all meter boxes, fire hydrants, and other waterworks facility improvements and appurtenances.

This Paragraph No. 5, though, shall not prevent the GRANTOR from crossing over, constructing, and maintaining roadways within the easement area or laying, operating,

maintaining, repairing, or removing conduits and drains which do not interfere with the exercise of the GRANTEE's rights under this easement; and

6. That the GRANTOR covenants with the GRANTEE that the GRANTOR is the lawful owner of the land which is the subject of this easement area, that the GRANTOR has good right and title to grant this easement, and that the GRANTOR will warrant and defend the same unto the GRANTEE against the claims and demands of all persons.

When used within this document the term "GRANTOR" shall mean the singular and plural, masculine and feminine, and natural persons, trustees, corporations, partnerships, limited partnerships, sole proprietorships and other forms of business entities. The term shall also mean the GRANTOR's or GRANTORs' estates, heirs, personal representatives, successors, successors-in-trust and assigns.

IT IS FURTHER MUTUALLY AGREED that the terms of this easement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of all the parties to this document and that all covenants and obligations undertaken by two or more persons shall be deemed to be joint and several unless a contrary intention is clearly expressed in this document.

This Grant of Easement may be executed in counterparts. Each counterpart shall be executed by one or more parties hereinbefore named and the several counterparts shall constitute one instrument to the same effect as though the signatures of all the parties are upon the same document.



Re: Discussion and Possible Action to approve the Manager's recommendation regarding the correspondence from Nikki Cristobal of Kamāwaelualani Corp. re: Koloa Water Tower Mural dated June 24, 2021

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board deny Kamāwaelualani Corporation's request to paint mural on a DOW water tank located in the Kalaheo-Lawai-Omao-Koloa-Poipu water system.

FUNDING: N/A

BACKGROUND:

On June 24, 2021, the Board received an email from Ms. Nikki Cristobal indicating interest in painting a cultural mural on a DOW water tank near Koloa Road. The stated purpose of the public mural is to tell the mo'olelo (stories/ narratives) of our unique Kaua'i history to preserve and perpetuate Hawaiian culture.

Ms. Cristobal also left a phone message for the Chief of Operations. The Chief of Operations called Ms. Cristobal and subsequently left a message denying her request. The Department does not support the request for the following reasons:

- 1. It poses a security risk. The mural will draw attention to the water tank. The water tank is considered essential infrastructure.
 - Even though we cannot completely conceal our tanks we paint them to blend in with the surrounding area. Not only for security reasons, but also for aesthetic reasons to maintain the natural environment and landscape.
 - The mural may invite graffiti and/or trespassing on to the tank site. Vandalism creates a host of issues and a lot of unanswered questions: How and how quickly any graffiti can be removed. If it cannot be removed, how quickly can the mural be restored? If the damage is substantial, who pays to paint over the mural? Who is responsible for other types of damage to the facility that may be directly or indirectly related to the mural?
 - DOW conferred with the Department of Health (DOH) and DOH is strongly opposed to the placement of murals on water tanks. We both see this as a potential security risk to an important infrastructure asset.
- 2. It creates a traffic hazard. The tank is located along a curved portion of Koloa Road in an area with a significant grade where many accidents (some fatal) have occurred. The mural painted on the tank will create a distraction for drivers increasing the potential for accidents. In addition, vehicles may stop along the roadside to take pictures creating an additional hazard on a curved section of road to potentially distracted drivers.

- 3. Additional staff time is required to preparing an agreement, coordinating, provide access and inspecting the site. It may also include permitting and an environmental assessment.
- 4. DOW will need to establish insurance requirements, liability and indemnification and ensure these are kept up to date.
- 5. It would set a precedent that could lead to similar requests and an even larger impact on staff time and enhanced security risks.

Customers located in the affected service area are advised to prepare for the shutdown by taking the following steps:





Dispute over public water rights on Kauai heads to state Supreme Court

HONOLULU (HawaiiNewsNow) - The state Supreme Court has agreed to hear a case over public water rights on Kauai.

The case is over a dispute of a new 18-inch pipe proposed by the Kauai Department of Water, which would tap into the East Wailua Watershed.

Officials said the pipe would serve communities from Puhi to Kapaa.

However, the group, Kia'i Wai 'o Wai'ale ale, said the county did not properly study how this installation would affect natural resources and cultural practices on the island.

The case was pending at the appeals court — but in an unusual move, the justices unanimously agreed to take it over.

Environmentalists consider this decision a big win.

"Water is life and a failure to follow federal law and the Hawaii Environmental Protection Act when diverting the water from our streams without permit cannot continue," said Friends of Mahaulepu, co-founder of Kia`i Wai`ale`ale.





Water Balance Diagram




